
Addressing Violent Crime




Objectives Established in 2017


- Tackle select contributors to violent crime**

Rates per 100,000




Total Part 1 violent crime has increased 14.7% in 2017 compared to 2016. Homicides are up 8.3% (39 deaths vs 36 deaths in 2016); and, assault with a deadly weapon is up 12.4%.






