William Henry Chafe Oral History Collection

Collection Description: The William Henry Chafe Oral History Collection spans the years 1933 through 1978, with most of the materials dated between 1972 and 1978. The collection consists mainly of oral history interview tapes and transcripts done in the 1970s, but also includes interview notes and research files related to Chafe's book Civilities and Civil Rights: Greensboro, North Carolina and the Black Struggle for Freedom, published in 1980.
