Enhancing Greensboro Police Department's BWC Program

Brief Project Summary

The intent of the Greensboro Police Department (GPD)'s Body-worn Camera (BWC) program is to develop, implement, and evaluate this equipment as one tool in the agency's comprehensive problem-solving approach. In-line with the Department's initiative to implement Neighborhood Oriented Policing (NOP), BWCs work to enhance officer interactions with the public and build community trust. Elements of the program include:

- A planned and phased approach.
- Collaborative partnerships with cross-agency criminal justice stakeholders.
- Review and implementation of appropriate privacy policies.
- Review and implementation of operational procedures and tracking mechanisms.
- Training officers and administrators on appropriate use and associated agencies requiring access to digital multimedia evidence.
- Fine-tuning practices and deployment of equipment which address operational requirements.

Having been established in 2013, the GPD's BWC Program is still in its infancy. However, the use of BWC has had a marked effect. Immediate direct benefits to the agency's community policing strategies have been seen in field training, traffic interdiction, patrol operations, and high visibility walking detail in high density venues. Moreover, the BWC footage has provided tremendous evidentiary value in court proceedings, internal investigations and training issues.

The GPD's Command Staff and Greensboro City officials embrace this technology as it enhances the Department's community policing strategies, addresses effective use of manpower and resources and enhances public legitimacy and transparency, while protecting the safety of both citizen and

The GPD serves the City of Greensboro, North Carolina. Greensboro is the third largest city in North Carolina with a population of 279,651 (2013). The City is centrally located in the Piedmont Triad, which encompasses Winston Salem, High Point and Greensboro supporting a population of approximately 1,640,717 citizens. Greensboro is neighbored regionally by Raleigh-Durham and Charlotte and is situated at the convergence of several major interstates.

Prior to the BWC discussions and purchases, the department has successfully utilized in-car dash cameras for their traffic enforcement units since 1998. The department has long recognized the departmental and community advantages of event video and has evolved their processes and departmental culture around the introduction of the technology. The department continues to adapt to new technology and to the community's needs, seeking a sound, appropriate and balanced approach to handling police event video that encompasses the needs of the department, of the officer, of the citizens and of the law.

From 2013 to the present, the department has devoted significant resources, including federal funding, budget funding and private donations to up-fit the department with the current compliment of 323 cameras. In addition to financing, the department devoted and is still devoting tremendous human resources to determine deployment, departmental policy, legal compliance, citizen concerns and privacy issues. Prior to the first roll-out in 2013, the department contacted numerous agencies as well as law enforcement associations for their policies/procedures related to BWC; however, those departments either had no policies or the policies were too rudimentary to adopt. Therefore, Greensboro created their own from the ground up and has disseminated theirs to many other agencies to adopt. Having created the industry prototype, the department must now update the policies and implementation to reflect the growing community clamor, political involvement, and legal environment that were not present in 2012.

The GPD has extensive experience partnering with national and local law enforcement agencies, non-profit agencies and local business partners for community policing initiatives, grant-funded programs and demonstration projects. Our project partners include City of Greensboro Management, the Guilford County Superior Court and Chief District Court Judge, the Greensboro Police Foundation, the Guilford County Family Justice Center, the Greensboro Child Response Initiative and Guilford County Assistant District Attorney.
