

## **Greensboro Fire Department** City Council Committee - Public Safety

City of Greensboro October 2015



- Provide basic, core function of local government fire protection, rescue, hazardous materials, prevention services
- Department is focused on service delivery
- We prioritize safety, courtesy, excellent service, efficiency and continuous improvement
- Providing service from 25 strategically located community fire stations. Construction of our 26<sup>th</sup> fire station to begin late fall.
- Respond to more than 33,000 emergencies annually 90 plus per day
- Firefighters provide coverage to the city by working on three distinct 24 hour shifts 147 firefighters per shift.
- FEMA SAFER Grant awarded will cover salaries of Service Enhancement approved (6 positions), plus 6 additional positions for two (2) years. This accomplishes Council's goal of placing 4 firefighters on all emergency response apparatus; 151 firefighters per shift.



### **Greensboro Fire Overview**

- North Carolina Search and Rescue (SAR)
  - Provided state level training to 110 staff members
  - Allowed for state resources to be utilized locally.
- North Carolina Hazardous Materials Regional Response Team (RRT)
  - Provided state level training to 79 staff members
  - Allowed for state resources to be utilized locally.
- Aircraft Rescue and Firefighting (ARFF)
  - Partner with Piedmont Triad International (PTI) Fire Department to provide crash rescue services.
- Foam Task Team
  - Providing specialized response for tank farm emergencies.
- Bike Team
  - Providing specialized response for trails, greenways and city sponsored events where fire apparatus is limited.



## **Greensboro Fire Accomplishments**


- We are a high performing department Greensboro Fire is recognized as a fire and rescue services industry leader - top 5% of all fire departments in the United States
  - National Insurance Rating System required
    - Class 1 fire protection, since February, 1992
    - Of the 30,052 fire department in the nation, Greensboro Fire remains 1 of approx 100 Class 1 departments and 1 of 6 in North Carolina.
    - Insurance rating system provides a direct reduction to homeowners and business insurance premiums
  - National Industry Standards/Third Party Review
    - Accredited department since August, 1997
    - One of only 217 accredited Fire Departments in the United States, one of only 19 in North Carolina
    - We are regulated by numerous national standards and OSHA
    - One of 34 departments in the nation to be awarded ISO Class 1 and National Accreditation.
  - Performance measurement voluntary
    - North Carolina School of Government benchmarking
    - International City-County Management Association (ICMA) benchmarking
- Most recent significant operational enhancement replacement of 12 year old self contained breathing apparatus (air packs) to improve firefighter safety.



- Replacement of 12 year old self contained breathing apparatus (air packs) to improve firefighter safety.
- Implementation of Automatic Vehicle Location (AVL) based dispatch to reduce response times.
- Implementation of auto-enroute and auto-arrive time stamping to collect more accurate data for better performance measures.
- Awarded AFG grant which provided fitness equipment for all fire stations.
- Awarded FEMA SAFER grant to increase daily staffing levels to align GFD with NFPA 1710.

- 1. Complete 2006 Voter Approved Bond Fire Stations
  - 4 stations completed (Willow Rd., W. Vandalia Rd., Mt. Hope Church Rd., and Reedy Fork Parkway)
  - 1 yet to be built (Burlington Rd. #63)
- 2. Minority and female recruitment/Retention
- 3. Succession Planning and Attrition Issues
- 4. Needed technology upgrades for Public Safety Training Facility
- 5. Future bond issue for replacement of Fire Station 56 (former county station) and other 50+ year fire stations
