Greensboro's Participatory Budgeting

- Direct democracy encouraging development of "public wisdom" by residents who allocate money from the city budget
- Approved by City Council in October 2014
- \$500,000 to be allocated from 2016-2017 budget
 - 0.23% of the General Fund Budget¹
 - \$100,000 per district
 - Capital projects only
- Greensboro PB launched publicly in October 2015
 - Steering Committee appointed by City Council

Evaluation Method

Idea Collection Phase: October – December 2015

- 159 surveys
- 223 pages, typed field notes from all 12 neighborhood assemblies
- 23 interviews

Budget Proposal Phase: December – in progress

- 40 surveys
- 72 pages, typed field notes (to 2/15/16)

Idea Collection Events

- 12 neighborhood assemblies
- 24 pop-up events
- Promoted on social media, traditional media, and through community organizations and connections
- 1,098 participants
 - 146 at neighborhood assemblies
 - 952 at pop-up events
- 675 ideas collected
- 66 ideas submitted as project proposals to staff for review



Greensboro PB Project Ideas by Category

Idea Collection Participants Key Findings

- Participants were generally representative of Greensboro's population by City Council district and in ethnicity, income, and gender.
- 85% had not previously attended a City of Greensboro budget meeting.
- 41% worked with others in the past year to address a community concern.
- Nearly 3 out of 4 voted in the last local election.
- While most said they trusted Greensboro's elected leaders at least some of the time, 1 in 5 did not feel this way.

Interviewees Reported

- People enjoyed sharing ideas and discussions with other residents
 - PB is positively influencing civic engagement, social capital and **community building**.
- PB is seen as a starting point for deeper citizen engagement
 - PB is empowering participants and demonstrating inclusive, equitable practices that are drawing in historically underrepresented community members.
- People express more positive feelings for city government and council members
 - PB is fostering **transparent** relationships between residents and city government
- PB is recognized as time intensive


