- Annual Action Plan is required to receive federal grant funds from the Dept. of Housing and Urban Development [HUD]
- Projects address priorities approved in the 2015-2019 Consolidated Plan and honor long term commitments such as redevelopment plans and activities
- Plan adoption process:
 - March 16, 2016 Planning Board public hearing
 - ➤ March 18, 2016 Public comment period open through April 18
 - April 7, 2016 Published Annual Plan summary
 - ➤ April 19, 2016 City Council considers recommendations
 - May 15, 2016 Plan must be submitted to HUD.

Housing Opportunities for Persons with AIDS (HOPWA) \$ 325,096


Total Federal Funding: \$3,307,286




Federal HUD Funding

Next Steps

- April 19, 2016 City Council public hearing and approval to submit the application for federal HUD grant funds
- Annual Action Plan must be submitted to HUD by May 15, 2016
- Annual Action Plan becomes effective for fiscal year 2016-2017.

- Production and preservation of housing units that are affordable to low and moderate incomes
- Promote fair housing
- Help stabilize neighborhoods and reduce crime
- Increase the tax base
- Leverage additional funds for housing and community development
