






Greensboro Violent Crime Over Time







- Total Part 1 violent crime has increased 11% in 2016 compared to 2015. Homicides are up 33% (36 deaths vs 27 deaths in 2015);
 and, assault with a deadly weapon is up 26%.
- Per capita rates are roughly the same as in 1981, and significantly less than the peak in 1995.

Greensboro Violent Crime in 2016



- In 2016, these six areas accounted for 22% of Greensboro's violent crime and 25% of violent offenses involving firearms.
- Over the last two years there was a 53% increase in Part 1 violent crime in these areas compared to 2014. Violent offenses involving firearms increased 73% these areas compared to 2014.
- In 2016, there was a 13% increase in Part I violent crime in these areas compared to 2015. Violent offenses involving firearms in these areas increased 16% compared to 2015.






