This City Council meeting of the City of Greensboro was called to order at 5:30 p.m. on the above date in the Council Chamber of the Melvin Municipal Office Building with the following members present:

### Moment of Silence

The meeting opened with a moment of silence.

### Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag

Mayor Pro-Tem Johnson recognized Councilmember Wells to lead the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

City Manager Jim Westmoreland recognized Tykia Johnson of the Legislative Department who served as Courier for the meeting.

### **Council Procedure for Conduct of the Meeting**

Mayor Pro-Tem Johnson explained the Council procedure for conduct of the meeting; and stated the speakers from the floor time period would take place at the first meeting of the month.

18-014 ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE PROXIMITY PRINT WORKS, 1700 FAIRVIEW STREET, AS A GUILFORD COUNTY LANDMARK

WHEREAS, all the prerequisites to the adoption of the ordinance, as prescribed by Chapter 160A, Article 19, Part 3C of the North Carolina General Statutes, have been met; and

WHEREAS, the Guilford County Historic Preservation Commission has submitted a report, which is incorporated herein by reference, and recommended in a public hearing on November 21, 2017 that the property described below be designated as a historic landmark; and

WHEREAS, appropriate notice has been given of the public hearing as required by law; and

WHEREAS, the Guilford County Historic Preservation Commission finds that the property described herein is of historical, architectural, educational, and/or cultural significance, and its preservation should be encouraged so as to safeguard the heritage of the City and County for the education, pleasure and enrichment of the residents of the City and County.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GREENSBORO:

1. The City Council of the City of Greensboro accepts the findings of the Guilford County Historic Preservation Commission and adopts the recommendation of the Commission for the preservation of the subject property by the authority set forth in Chapter 160A, Article 19, Part 3C of the North Carolina General Statutes and local ordinance adopted pursuant thereto.

2. The designation is for includes interior common areas, exterior facades of the mill buildings, and the 18.2 acre site.

3. A Guilford County Landmark plaque shall be installed on the property and such sign shall indicate that the property has been designated as a Historic Landmark. Details of the display of the plaque are to be approved by the Guilford County Historic Preservation Commission before installation.

4. The procedures provided by law, including waiting period, shall be observed prior to demolition, alteration, remodeling or removal of the designated property. This includes the process of approving a Certificate of Appropriateness before any changes are made to this designated property.

5. A certified copy of this ordinance is to be appropriately recorded with the Register of Deeds, the Guilford County Tax Department and City of Greensboro Engineering and Inspections Department in accordance with provisions of Chapter 160A, Article 19, Part 3C of the North Carolina General Statutes and the local ordinance adopted pursuant thereto.

6. This ordinance shall be effective from and after its adoption.

Assistant City Manager Parrish explained the use of the Pavement Condition Report (PCR) and rating from 2016; spoke to the management of the fund allocations; to the Powell Bill and Motor Vehicle fees; a current PCR rating of 60; the purpose of the street Bond; the timeframe for the resurfacing; and provided an overview of the Goal Setting Committee's review of subcontractors.

Council requested staff to continue to review options to de-bundle contracts for M/WBE businesses; to provide Goal Setting information with future agenda items; to schedule a work session to review the M/WBE disparity study; and to explore options to create a small business enterprise program.

City Manager Westmoreland spoke to the importance of the Disparity Study update prior to additional small business enterprise discussions.

Matters to be discussed by the Mayor and Members of the Council

Councilmember Kennedy spoke to the Printworks project; to affordable housing; and to a recent Court ruling regarding Body Worn Camera footage.

Councilmember Wells highlighted the Printworks project; an open house at the Renassiance Co-Op (Co-Op) for healthcare; the Co-Op Shops on Phillips day on March 3rd; referenced a previous food desert; encouraged everyone to support the Co-Op; spoke to the Summit Avenue streetscape presentation on Thursday; and to the Citizens for Economical and Environmental Justice meeting on February 26th at Laughlin Memorial United Methodist Church.

Councilmember Kennedy echoed excitement for the Co-Op; stated the Co-Op was an example of the type of projects and programs for Greensboro; voiced concerns regarding the school shooting in Florida; and commended the recent activities of the Greensboro Police Department in response to concerns on local campuses.

Mayor Pro-Tem Johnson spoke to the representation by Council at NC Works to see Governor Roy Cooper; to a passion for jobs in training; to living wages; highlighted the events of Kindness Day at Ervin Elementary; and

expressed condolences for the situation in Florida.

Councilmember Abuzuaiter expressed condolences for those impacted in Florida; spoke to Greensboro Police Officers talking to community groups; the Co-Op healthcare facility; highlighted the Greensboro Police Department graduation; the Police Explorer programs; and a meet and greet at Mt. Zion last Saturday. Councilmember Abuzuaiter spoke to attending a Star Community presentation; and requested staff to research the Star Community criteria for Greensboro; referenced attending a Greensboro Sports Commission meeting; and the need to support sporting events in Greensboro.

Councilmember Outling expressed excitement for the Printworks project; the utilization of assets in the City; spoke to the need to focus on infrastructure improvements; and to the Parks and Recreation Master Plan kickoff on February 22nd from 5 p.m. to 8 p.m.

Councilmember Hightower expressed condolences to the Florida victims; spoke to protecting the community; referenced the possible cancellation of an upcoming gun show; voiced concern with a Court ruling regarding Body Worn Camera footage; negative publicity regarding the Co-Op; spoke to college student interns; and to Black History Month.

Discussion took place regarding the signing of the Court order by the Judge; the history of Council action; and the timeline for Council to view the footage.

City Manager Westmoreland spoke to the work session agenda for March 6th; recessing into closed session after the regular meeting; and to an estimated start time of 3:30 p.m.

City Attorney Carruthers spoke to the review of professional standards; and to the need to schedule a time for viewing of the footage.

Councilmember Hightower requested Community Partners Board term-limits; and for staff to provide information regarding Council Board and Commission liaison appointments.

City Manager Westmoreland confirmed staff would provide term-limit information.

City Clerk Betsey Richardson spoke to reviewing the liaison appointments with Mayor Nancy Vaughan prior to it coming back to Council.

Councilmember Wells stated she attended the League of Women Voters at the Pin High School of the Arts; spoke to a Sit In at the Woolworths in High Point after the Greensboro Sit In; and to the reflection of the history in the campus facilities and school programs.

### Matters to be presented by the City Manager

City Manager Westmoreland stated there had been an inaccurate commercial regarding drinking water; and emphasized the water was safe to drink.

#### Matters to be presented by the City Attorney

Discussion took place with City Attorney Carruthers regarding possible legal action for the false commercial.
