






OVERALL MULTIMODAL CIRCULATION PATTERNS

- Redistribute underused roadway areas





- Encourage riders of all abilities






KEY STREETS

 - Create special event street








North Elm

 - Celebrate arts and culture at Tanger Center








Davie Street

- Existing Character
 - Anchored by 2 parks at north end
 - Residential/retail at south end
- Community Vision
 - Create an active pedestrian friendly multimodal urban retail street
 - Serve automobile and parking access to existing and planned development along Davie, Elm, etc.
 - Maintain major automobile flow and transit service
 - Repurpose excess roadway to provide safe and protected bike facilities in both directions





(North Section)








Davie Street Proposed (South Section)






Church Street

- Existing character
 - Key anchors
 - Galyard Depot
 - Greensboro Childrens Museum
 - Greensboro Public Library
 - New node developing around Cadillac Garage
- Community Vision:
 - Create iconic family friendly play street
 - Create a vibrant linear park programmed with child friendly activities and a shared pedestrian/bike pathway
 - Provide outdoor experiences near museum,
 library, and future Experiential School










Market Street

- Existing Character
 - Important commuter route
 - Key commercial corridor, fronted by civic campus and landmark Jefferson Standard building
- Community Vision
 - Enhance multimodal road with greenway connections
 - Provide protected bike facilities
 (complemented by future bike facilities on Friendly)
 - Strengthen pedestrian friendly civic character of the street
 - Provide flexible parking lanes








Bellemeade Street

- Existing Character
 - Narrow ROW
 - Major anchors (Ballpark, Tanger Center)
 - Important link to downtown from Westerwood neighborhood
- Community Vision
 - Realize role as a great entertainment corridor
 - Strengthen pedestrian friendly character connecting neighborhoods to destinations
 - Incorporate as flexible street
 - Remove right turn lane onto Greene and left turn lane
 - Close Greene-Edgeworth for games





 - Urban Flex Street (Blue)




