IMPACT/POLICY ANALYSIS

Land Use Compatibility

The proposed City R-3 (Residential – Single Family – 3 du/ac) zoning would allow land uses that are compatible with the general character of the area.

Connections 2025 Comprehensive Plan Policies

The Generalized Future Land Use Map designates this location as **Moderate Residential (5 – 12 d.u./acre)**. The requested **City R-3 (Residential – Single Family – 3 du/ac)** zoning district is generally inconsistent with the **Moderate Residential (5 – 12 d.u./acre)** GFLUM designation, however, per City Council adopted policy, a GFLUM amendment is not required for re-zoning requests that are less than one acre, or that do not involve a significant physical change resulting in new or expanded structures. The Growth Strategy Map designates the subject site as being within Growth Tier 1, Current Growth Area (2013 – 2019).

Connections 2025 Written Policies

Land Use Goal 4.3 – Growth at the Fringe: Provide a development framework for the fringe that guides sound, sustainable patterns of land use, limits sprawl, protects rural character, evidences sound stewardship of the environment, and provides for efficient provision of public services and facilities as the City expands. Development will increase density and

mix land uses at a pedestrian scale with sidewalks, bikeways, and where possible, public transit.

Policy 4F: Initiate a fringe area growth management framework comprising the following elements:

- Create a Fringe Area Land Use Plan;
- Establish a "tiered" approach that designates growth areas for staged development, annexation, and extension of public facilities within the water and sewer service boundary;
- Define specific criteria for water and sewer extensions and annexations;
- Initiate designation of the fringe as Greensboro's extraterritorial jurisdiction; and
- Establish a proactive plan to provide infrastructure in advance of development, consistent with the growth "tiers" and Fringe Area Land Use Concept Plan.

Policy 4G: Improve the quality and patterns of development through incentives and regulatory guidelines.

Community Character, Goal 5.2 – Man-Made Environment: Preserve and enhance the character and visual quality of Greensboro's built environment, including historic resources, private developments, and public landscapes.

Policy 5E: Improve the aesthetic quality of publicly owned and maintained landscapes.

Policy 5F: Implement and improve design standards governing the appearance of development from public roadways.

Housing and Neighborhoods, Goal 6: Meet the needs of present and future Greensboro citizens for a choice of decent, affordable housing in stable, livable neighborhoods that offer security, quality of life, and the necessary array of services and facilities.

Policy 6C: Promote the diversification of new housing stock to meet the needs of all citizens for suitable, affordable housing.

Transportation, Goal 8: Develop and maintain a safe, efficient, and environmentally sound transportation system that provides convenient choices for accessing destinations throughout Greensboro and the Triad, including a range of well-integrated transit, pedestrian, and bicycle linkages.

Policy 8A: Maintain a roadway network that safely and efficiently accommodates vehicular traffic while supporting other community objectives defined in the Comprehensive Plan.

Connections 2025 Map Policies

Moderate Residential (5 – 12 d.u./acre): This category accommodates housing types ranging from small-lot, single-family detached and attached single-family dwellings such as townhomes to moderate density, low-rise apartment dwellings.

Growth Tier 1, Current Growth Area (2013 – 2019): Where infrastructure systems are in place, can be economically provided and/or will be proactively extended and where continued annexation and consolidation of the City's development pattern shall be encouraged over the next six years.

STAFF ANALYSIS AND RECOMMENDATION

Community Outreach

Applicant is strongly encouraged to discuss this proposed rezoning and development with owners of surrounding properties.

Staff Analysis

The 1 acre subject property is currently vacant. North, east, south and west of the request are single family dwellings zoned County RS-40 and City R-3.

The subject site is currently located in the County. The Growth Strategy Map designates the subject site as Growth Tier 1, Current Growth Area (2013 – 2019), where infrastructure systems are in place, can be economically provided and/or will be proactively extended. The Planning Board recommended approval of the associated annexation request for this property on March 20, 2019, after concluding this property can be served by required City services.

The Comprehensive Plan's Future Land Use Map designates this area as Moderate Residential. This category accommodates housing types ranging from small-lot, single-family detached and attached single-family dwellings such as townhomes to moderate density, low-rise apartment dwellings, generally at a density range of 5-12 dwelling units per acre. Per City Council adopted policy, rezoning requests of 1 acre or less do not trigger the requirement to amend the Comprehensive Plan.

The request for original zoning of R-3 (Residential Single Family - 3) will allow for development of a similar size and scale to nearby development and is the closest equivalent to the subject site's current County RS-40 zoning. The request is consistent with the Growth at the Fringe

goal to promote sound and sustainable patterns of land use at the City's fringe and the Housing and Neighborhoods goal to meet the needs of present and future Greensboro citizens for a choice of decent, affordable housing in stable, livable neighborhoods that offer security, quality of life, and the necessary array of services and facilities.

This request is consistent with the intent and purpose of the zoning code, the Comprehensive Plan (Connections 2025) and is generally compatible with the existing development and trend in the surrounding area.

Staff Recommendation

Staff recommends approval of the requested City R-3 (Residential Single Family - 3) zoning district.
