Development Focus Areas

Support future site development, development of downtown, and strategic reinvestment/redevelopment areas to 'Grow Greensboro' in specific focus areas to dramatically increase the opportunity for significant private investment and creation of new jobs

- > Focus on development and redevelopment opportunities in:
 - Greensboro-Randolph County Mega Site
 - > PTIA Airport Industrial Development
 - Revolution Mill Area
 - Downtown Greensboro
 - > Joint School of Nanoscience & Nano-engineering Area
 - > Infill Development Areas
- > Focus on highlighting infrastructure assets and geographic location
- > Focus public investment on high impact priority projects in the strategic targeted areas
- ➤ Utilize support of funded Economic Development partners Greensboro Chamber Economic Development, Downtown Greensboro, Inc., East Greensboro Now, Piedmont Business Capital, etc.

Development Focus Areas

- Greensboro-Randolph County Mega Site
 - **➤ Water & Sewer infrastructure design 95% complete**
 - > Phased Construction: beginning January 2020; completion late 2021
 - Collaboration with other partners to market & promote
- Revolution Mill Area Revolution Mill redevelopment
 - > \$85,000,000 investment
 - > Approximately 75 businesses located in Mill complex
 - ➤ Mixed-use: Apartments, Event spaces, Restaurants, etc.
- ➤ Joint School of Nanoscience & Nano-engineering Area Gateway Research Park
 - > Public-Private Partnership to support construction of new \$12M building
 - Manufacturing, laboratory, manufacturing, warehousing, distribution
 - Currently have 2 tenants
 - Successful recruitment of Core Technologies as anchor tenant



Development Focus Areas

- > PTIA Airport Industrial Development
 - > Site development to prepare 300+ acre aviation industrial site
 - > \$2.5M from 2006 ED Bond available for future infrastructure or project recruitment

Downtown Greensboro

- Centric Brands Divisional Headquarters
 - > \$2M projected investment
 - > At least 251 new jobs
 - Significant developer investment
- Christman Company Divisional Headquarters
 - > \$3.4M+ investment to restore historical Cascade Saloon building
 - > 53 new jobs + 25 retained jobs
- > \$50,000 of City support for a Downtown Strategic Plan
- ➤ Significant infrastructure and streetscape investment from 2016 Bonds



Business Recruitment

Continue to support and fund new business recruitment and strategic infrastructure investment activities to help ensure Greensboro focuses on its economic and market strengths and opportunities in the seven core cluster areas: Advanced Manufacturing, Arts & Design, Aviation, Furniture, Life Sciences, Specialized Business Services, and Supply Chain Logistics

- Provide annual funding support to Greensboro Chamber Economic Development
- > Focus on highlighting infrastructure assets and geographic location
- Focus public investment on high impact priority projects and in targeted areas (Reinvestment Areas and Corridors, Impact Zones)
- ➤ Participate in Guilford County Economic Development Alliance
- ➤ Focus on workforce development needs of business recruitment prospects to provide services to recruit, screen, select and train a workforce that meets the current and future needs, and boosts competitiveness and profitability

FY18-19 Partner Highlights

- Piedmont Business Capital approved \$198,545 in loans to 18
 Greensboro businesses ranging from \$610 to \$50,000.
- Launch Greensboro reports 61 companies completing the 101/Growth accelerator programs. 56 are still in business with 79% M/WBE participation.
- Triad Local First and Launch Greensboro took on leadership roles in the recruitment and implementation of eBay Retail Revival.
- Campus Greensboro placed 107 Fellows at 51 internship sites.
 88% of Fellows indicated they are interested in staying in Greensboro after graduation.
