





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2019 LEGISLATIVE UPDATE



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2019 Legislative Update THE BUDGET

HB 966: 2019 Appropriations Act.

- \rightarrow House passed their version of the budget on May 3.
- \rightarrow Senate passed their version of the budget on May 31.

→ Conference Committee – committee report presented June 25. →Conference report adopted by the House and the Senate – bill sent to the Governor on June 27.

 \rightarrow Governor vetoed HB 966 on June 28.

→ House placed veto override vote on the House calendar on July 1.
→ House held a vote to override the Governor's veto on September 11.
→ The Senate placed veto override vote on the Senate calendar on
October 28 but adjourned on October 31 without holding a vote to override.



Body Worn Cameras – HB 791: Law Enforcement Agency Recordings.

The City of Greensboro will continue to work towards favorable amendments to the current law, specifically to allow the Council to view recordings in closed sessions without being required to sign confidentiality agreements.



Triad Connected Cities – HB 431: FIBER NC Act.

Requesting \$1M in funding to help the city and its neighbors complete the fiber connection along 1-40/85 corridor from Winston-Salem to Greensboro and finish the 11.8-mile gap to Burlington.

Restore Transportation Funding

In 2017, the legislature diverted state transit funding from local transportation budgets to highway construction needs, resulting in a loss of \$500,000 in state funding to Greensboro.

Small Business Enterprise – HB 193/SB 166: Greensboro/Small Business Enterprise.

Seeking the authority to establish a Small Business Enterprise program to promote the development of small business in Greensboro.

<u>Repair of Nonresidential Buildings & Re-write of Planning Statutes</u> –

SB 355: Land-Use Regulatory Changes.

Seeking support for the re-write of Chapter 160A which would create a new Chapter 160D to reorganize city and county planning and development statues and allow a city to adopt a non-residential building code in a downtown or specified Municipal Service District.

Presumptive Disability for Fire Fighters

Seeking recognition that a disability can arise from a series of harmful exposures, not just a single accident. Presumptive disability allows for a disability claim to be made because of the cumulative effects of exposure to toxins or pollutants.

<u>Collection of Parking Fines Linked to DMV Registration</u> – <u>HB 748: Block</u> <u>Vehicle Regis. For Unpaid Parking Fines.</u>

The City of Greensboro is partnering with the City of Winston-Salem on this issue. The bill allows the collection of unpaid parking tickets by linking fines to the annual vehicle registration software maintained by the DMV. The City is requesting the authority to use the software for collection purposes.

Healthcare for Retired Councilmembers

The City Council requests the same benefit granted to county commissioners in 2009. Greensboro is requesting an appropriate amendment to obtain this benefit.

Fire Department: Search and Rescue Funds –

HB 159: State Search and Rescue Funding. *Budget Provision.

The Greensboro Fire Department and NC Coalition of Fire Chiefs request an appropriation of approximately \$2.3M in recurring funds to be used to support the search and rescue programs as provided in Article 6 of Chapter 166A. The funds will be used by local governments to supplement the expenses to purchase and maintain equipment.



Medical Detox Facility – HB 360: Guilford County Mental Health Facility/Funds.

*Budget Provision.

The City supports Guildford County receiving funding for a detox facility to provide this vital service to residents.



House Restoration/Recovery –

SB 110/HB 191: Housing Recovery/Restore Greensboro Funds.

The City of Greensboro is requesting \$1M to support housing restoration needs in the aftermath of the April 2018 tornado.

• SB 429: Disaster Recovery – 2019 Budget Provisions.

Mini-budget proposal to enact the 2019 Disaster Recovery Act to appropriate funds, including the Greensboro Tornado Aid.

Effective date of July 1, 2019 and signed into law by the Governor on September 18, 2019.

<u>Remove Property from City Limits –</u>

HB 181: Yanceyville/Greensboro/McDowell Cty Bd Ed.

The City is requesting the removal of the described property from the corporate limits of the City of Greensboro.





2018 ELECTORAL DISTRICTS




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



