## **Current Greensboro Fund Balance Policy**

## Fund Balance & Capital Reserve Policy – General Fund

- The City shall maintain an undesignated fund balance equal to 9% of the following year's General Fund adopted budget, with any amount in excess of 9% being credited to a capital reserve account until a minimum of \$10 million is accumulated
- Once the minimum goal is reached additional funds can be used for "payas-you-go" capital expenditures
- Before any appropriations can be made from Undesignated Fund Balance of the General Fund, seven yes votes from the nine-member Council shall be required

## Bring the fund balance to 15% of our annual budget by 2022

#### **Current Status**

#### **General Fund**

• 9% of subsequent budget, \$27.7 million

## **Capital Reserve**

- Remaining available Fund Balance, \$6.5 million
  - Improved by about \$1.5 million

## Goal

#### **General Fund**


• 9% of subsequent budget, \$27.7 million

## **Capital Reserve**

- Remaining available fund balance, approx. \$18.4 million
  - Approximately \$12 million more than current

## Fund Balance Results - General Fund

 Local Government Commission recommends minimum Fund Balance of 8% to cover 1 month of operations plus more for unforeseen emergencies



# **Strategies for Increasing Fund Balance**

#### To Achieve 15% Goal

General Fund net financial performance must improve by: \$2.4 million each year for five years

- Increased revenues
- Reduced expenditures
- Reduced reliance on fund balance
