Call to Order

This Public Safety Committee meeting of the City of Greensboro was called to order at 5:00 p.m. on the above date in the Council Chamber of the Melvin Municipal Office Building with the following members present:

11. <u>ID 16-0483</u> Resolution Authorizing Match Grant Application for Bureau of Justice Assistance Grant for Body-worn Camera Policy and Implementation Program

Assistant City Manager Chris Wilson recognized Police Chief Wayne Scott to speak to the item.

Police Chief Scott provided an overview of the item; verified the current cameras were three years old; explained that grant funds would allow each officer to have their own camera; would reduce wear and tear on the equipment; and stated the department was optimistic they would receive funding.

Councilmember Wilkins asked when the department would know about the grants; if there were any grants for storage costs; and what the City's current storage costs were.

Police Chief Scott responded that there were no grants for storage; stated that the current storage costs ran approximately \$310,000 annually; and spoke to the amount of footage recorded in a day.

Councilmember Wilkins asked Chief Scott's opinion on the current legislation regarding body worn camera footage.

Police Chief Scott responded that there had been positive conversation; and spoke to the impact of the legislation.

City Attorney Carruthers interjected that it had been a dynamic process; that Police Chief Scott's opinion had been heard by the Legislature; and spoke to the status of the proposals in the Legislature.
