PURPOSE:

The City of Greensboro Public Transportation Division received a grant award from the North Carolina Department of Transportation (NCDOT) Public Transportation Department to purchase mobile faring technology for the fixed route and paratransit fleet. A budget ordinance must be approved to establish the budget and allow the expenditure of funds.

BACKGROUND:

The Greensboro Urban Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (GUAMPO) adopted a resolution endorsing the Public Transportation Division’s application for funding under the NCDOT Advanced Technology grant program on October 24, 2018. This grant will allow GTA to purchase mobile faring technology for the fixed route and paratransit fleet. The City participated in a joint Request for Proposals (RFP) process with the Piedmont Authority for Regional Transportation (PART) and the City of High Point for a turn-key Mobile Ticketing solution in April 2018. The partners selected the firm of Delerrok due to the comprehensive and innovative solution they proposed. This purchase includes their Touchpass mobile readers, which allows for electronic validation of fares purchased via mobile devices. Each agency is in charge of their separate procurement process. The City will be using this grant funding to purchase 119 Touchpass readers (covering

both the fixed route and paratransit fleet as well as five spare units) and smart cards to replace the existing GO Pass.

BUDGET IMPACT:

The City will be required to provide matching funds in the amount of \$32,071. These funds are budgeted in the Transit Operations Account Number 564-4531-01. A budget adjustment will be required to move funds to the correct account.

The Department of Transportation recommends and requests that City Council approve the attached budget ordinance establishing the budget for the Fiscal Year 2020 Advanced Technology Grant.
